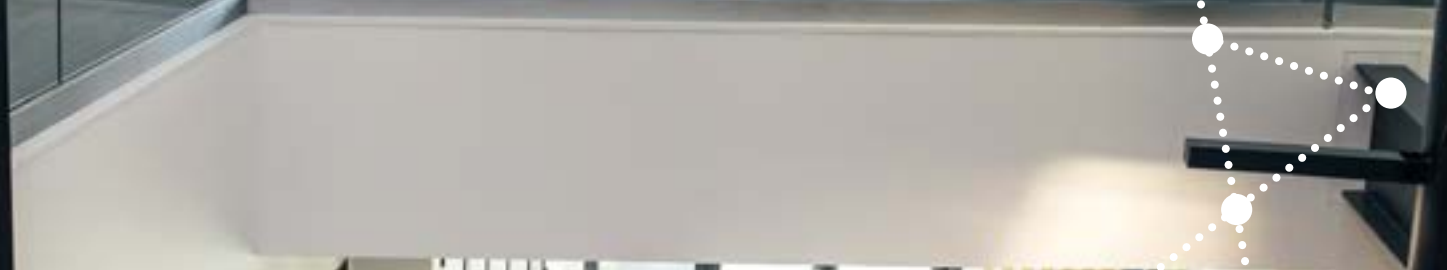

PŌHIRI

All new students are formally welcomed to Toi Ohomai on their first day with a pōhiri (traditional Māori welcome ceremony) at the marae or wharenui on campus.

TANGATARUA MARAE

Tangatarua - the name of the marae (Māori meeting house) at Mokoia Campus, in Rotorua - translates to "two peoples".

POMARE

Pomare is the wharenui (meeting house) at the Windermere Campus in Tauranga. It is named after a Māori ancestor from the local area.

ROAD TRANSPORT, WAREHOUSING & LOGISTICS TRAINING CENTRE

This fully functioning warehouse is located close to the Port of Tauranga, the largest port in New Zealand. It has been established with full support from the industry and is the only training facility of its kind in the country. The warehouse provides a realistic, hands-on learning environment, where our road transport students pick up and deliver loads to the warehouse, and our warehousing and distribution students unload and store goods.

PRE-DEPARTURE

ARRIVING IN NEW ZEALAND

If requested in advance, Toi Ohomai can arrange to have you picked up from Auckland, Rotorua or Tauranga airport. The International Centre staff will also meet you at your orientation day and will provide all the information you'll need to begin your study and settle into Toi Ohomai at Rotorua or Tauranga. You will be welcomed to Toi Ohomai with a pōhiri (traditional Māori welcome ceremony).

MONEY

- travel with only a small amount of cash
- bring traveller's cheques and a credit card to cover your initial expenses
- open a New Zealand bank account as soon as possible after your arrival

IMMIGRATION & STUDENT VISAS

If you're going to study in New Zealand for more than 12 weeks, you'll need to apply for a student visa. Check out www.immigration.govt.nz/new-zealand-visas/options/study.

ELIGIBILITY FOR HEALTH SERVICES

Most international students are not entitled to subsidised health services. If you receive medical treatment while in New Zealand, you may be required to pay the full costs of that treatment. More details are available through the Ministry of Health at www.health.govt.nz.

ACCIDENT INSURANCE

The Accident Compensation Corporation (ACC) provides accident insurance for all temporary visitors to New Zealand, but you may still be required to pay for some or all other medical and related costs. More details are available at www.acc.co.nz.

MEDICAL & TRAVEL INSURANCE

International students must have appropriate and current medical and travel insurance while in New Zealand. The cost of medical and travel insurance is less than \$790 per year. ACCOMMODATION OPTIONS

Toi Ohomai can help arrange accommodation while you are here for your studies.

HALL OF RESIDENCE (ROTORUA)

Tangatarua Hall of Residence, a hostel owned by Toi Ohomai, is located next to Mokoia Campus in Rotorua. Situated in a park-like setting with mature landscaping and open spaces, the hall offers our students an attractive and affordable place to live just a short walking distance to the campus.

SHARED ACCOMMODATION (TAURANGA)

Toi Ohomai offers rental houses close to Windermere Campus in Tauranga. The bedrooms are lockable and furnished. Living areas and bathrooms are shared with at least one other student. The houses contain essential cooking utensils, crockery and appliances, washing machine, fridge/freezer, and a television.



HOMESTAY

We recommend living in a homestay option, especially if you are studying English and want to be able to practise your English with your host family. The family environment can also ease the adjustment of living in a new country as you experience different food, language, and customs. We recommend you commit to staying at least one month with your homestay family while you adjust to life in Rotorua or Tauranga and while you and your homestay family adjust to each other.

The homestay fee of NZ\$195–250 per week includes your own room, three meals a day, power and laundry facilities. This fee may also include internet access.

FLATTING (SHARING A HOUSE)

If you plan to live in a rented house or apartment with one or more people, we call that “flattening”. You and your flatmates will be responsible for finding your own furniture, bedding, cooking utensils, and other household necessities. You can find all of these new items at shops in town or, to keep costs down, you can buy many things from second-hand shops.

You will need to share the cost of power and other bills, cook your meals, do your own laundry and your share of household cleaning, and abide by the rental agreement.

It can take some time to find a flat to rent and you may need to stay in temporary accommodation for the first two to four weeks after arriving in New Zealand. This is where a hall of residence, shared accommodation, or homestay option would be desirable.



ACCOMMODATION FOR FAMILIES

Most of the accommodation providers Toi Ohomai works with are set up to host individual students only; few can accept a family or couple.

If you plan to bring your family, we strongly recommend that you come to New Zealand on your own first and arrive a couple of weeks before our orientation programme. Arriving early will give you time to look for long-term family accommodation in the private housing market.

If your family comes with you, you may need to stay in a hotel or motel while you try to find long-term accommodation. This can be very expensive.

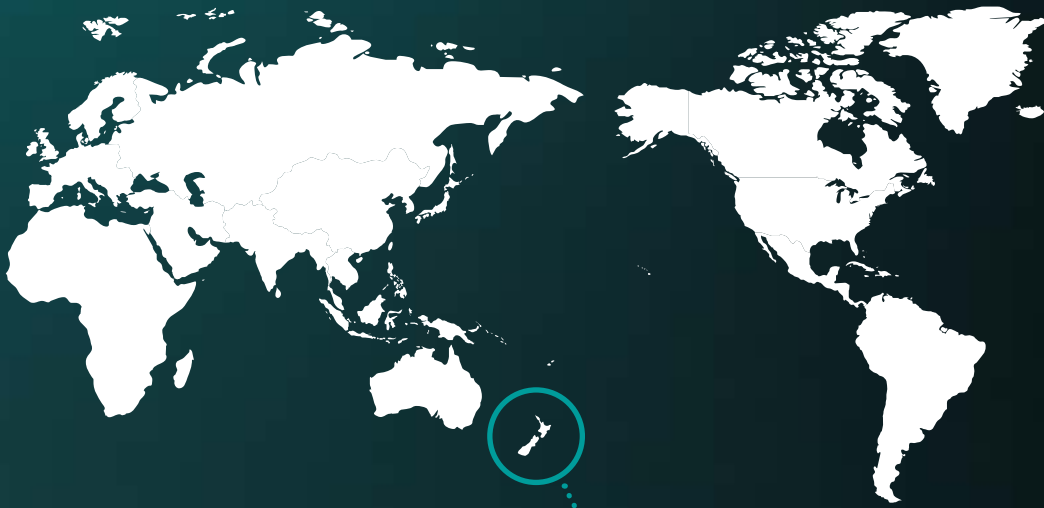
BASIC EXPENSES
