

Final year projects


Your final project will showcase your learning and help you develop new skills. This could be a dissertation, a work-based project, performance, or a scientific research study.


Students' Union

Our pathway programmes

We have specially designed courses to prepare international students for entry to Brunel.

Nearly 4,500 students who have completed a pathway programme at Brunel University London International College – our on-campus pathway provider – have progressed onto graduating with a full undergraduate or postgraduate degree from Brunel.

We have multiple intakes throughout the year, in September, January and May, giving you more flexibility over when to start your studies.

Foundation stage

Foundation stage is for students who do not quite meet Brunel's direct entry criteria.

International Year 1

This covers the first-year curriculum of a Brunel degree in smaller class sizes and with extra academic contact hours. This will enable you to fully develop your knowledge and understanding of each module.

Pre-master's

We offer pre-master's courses in : Arts, Business Computing/ Computer Science, Business and Management, Engineering and Design, Environmental Science and Sustainability and Law.

How to apply for an undergraduate course

1

UCAS Applications open

From 1 September 2020, you'll be able to submit your application.

The deadline to apply for most courses is 15 January, although check the UCAS website for information on the course you are interested in.

2

Complete and submit your application

Universities will decide whether to make you an offer, which will either be unconditional (if entry requirements are met) or conditional (if offer is based on exam results).

If you submit your application by 15 January, you must respond to any offers you receive by early May (check UCAS for 2021 deadline dates).

3

UCAS Extra opens

If you have used all five choices earlier on in the cycle and don't receive any offers, or you decide to decline any offers you have received, you can use UCAS Extra to apply for more choices.

Any applications received after 30 June are automatically entered into Clearing.

4

Confirmation of your offer

You can see the status of your application in UCAS Track and check if your place has been confirmed.

If your choice is unconditional, the place is yours. If it is conditional, the university will update your status when they receive your results.

5

Clearing and Adjustment

If your application is unsuccessful, you can use Clearing to apply for more courses.

If you do better than expected and exceed the conditions of your firm choice, you can look for an alternative course using Adjustment.



Degree and course structure

Undergraduate study

Undergraduate awards

Brunel awards the following first degrees:

- Bachelor of Engineering BEng
- Bachelor of Music BMus
- Bachelor of Science BSc
- Bachelor of Laws LLB
- Bachelor of Arts BA

Brunel also offers the following integrated master's degrees:

- Master of Engineering MEng
- Master of Science MSci
- Master of Mathematics MMath

First degrees are usually awarded with honours and classified into first class, second class (with upper and lower divisions) or third class.

The three-part year

Brunel's course structure is based on three periods of study per year. There are two teaching terms of 12 weeks each, running from September to December and from January to Easter.

There is then a third, shorter term for revision, examination and assessment.

Students who take a four-year placement course will spend a further period in either one or two work placements.

There are some exceptions to this. For example, students on Physiotherapy, Occupational Therapy and Specialist Community Public Health Nursing courses may take clinical work experience (see the individual course pages for details).

Joint honours degrees

Some subjects can be combined with a selected second subject to form a joint honours programme. You'll find details of possible combinations on the individual course pages on our website. The proportion of credits you will be expected to attain in each subject is set out in the programme specification.

Postgraduate study

Programme start dates

Courses start at the end of September and last approximately one year. There are a few courses that also start in January.

Programme structure

Master's courses are made up of modules and a dissertation worth a set number of credits. A full master's degree represents 180 credits: around 120 are for the course modules and around 60 for the dissertation. If you decide to take a shorter course, a postgraduate certificate requires 60 credits and a postgraduate diploma requires 120 credits.

You can expect a mix of lectures, seminars and small-group teaching. Students in technology or science-based disciplines will have some laboratory-based and practical components.

Your dissertation

You will complete your written dissertation (usually between 10,000 and 15,000 words) during the final third of your course. The dissertation represents a detailed piece of research carried out by you, with supervision by a course tutor. You will be expected to work independently and to demonstrate sufficient mastery of your chosen topic. We also want to see you demonstrate your ability to organise and present the material.

Postgraduate research

A doctoral programme usually takes three years and a MPhil usually takes one to two years to complete. Our start dates are in October, January and April, allowing you to benefit from the research methods study blocks, campus activities and support provided at the start of a new academic term.


